We are pleased to announce the call for papers on featured contemporary philosophical problems, contemporary culture, religious studies, social service and social technologies for the first volume of the scientific journal:

«TECHNE»

Articles formatted in accordance with the requirements should be submitted no later than **August 21, 2023.**

The journal is intended for scientific and pedagogical workers, research facilities employees, doctoral and postdoctoral students, postgraduate students, and students of higher education institutions.

Journal Sections: Scientific articles, interviews with experts, books and events reviews and summaries, discussions, translations, archive, scientific life.

AUTHOR'S GUIDELINES:

- The volume of the publication is no more than 20-22 thousand characters (from 8 pages); format A-4; font Times New Roman Cyr; size 14; interval 1.5; margins: top, bottom, right 2 cm, left 3 cm.
- The article begins with the name of the UDC.

Next line – author's surname and name, academic degree, title, position, affiliation, Orcid ID, e-mail.

The title of the publication is given at intervals, in the centre, in large bold letters. A short abstract and keywords in Ukrainian are given at interval after the title. The main text of the article begins with a paragraph at intervals. Paragraph indentation is 10 mm.

- References throughout the text are given in square brackets, where the first digit indicates the number from the list of references (the list is given at the end of the article), in order in which they appear in the text; after the comma, the page number of the cited source is given at intervals (e.g. [1, 234].), and a period (or other punctuation mark) is placed only after the closed square bracket.
- Tables and figures may be used supplement the textual information. All the tables and figures in the paper are attached in a separate file in Microsoft Excel format. Figures and tables are numbered in Arabic numerals. A figure or table from another source must be cited with reference to the original source.

The title of the figure should always appear below the figure. Use Times New Roman, *italic*, 12 pt, for the number of figure, and Times New Roman, *italic*, 12 pt, bold, centre, for the table title. Do not use a period at the end of a title.

The table title is placed above the table (Table 1). To designate the table number, use Times New Roman, *italic*, 12 pt, for the table title – Times New Roman, italic, 12 pt, bold, centre. Do not use a full stop at the end of the title.

If language examples are analyzed in the text of the article, they should be written in a slanted font and, if possible, placed from a new paragraph. The translation and explanation of the examples should be placed in quotation marks, e.g. in Ukrainian: задача «task». Examples in other (non-Ukrainian) languages are glossed according to the Leipzig Glossary (http://www.eva.mpg.de/lingua/resources/glossing-rules.php).

Structure of a Scientific Article

The article must contain the following headings (in bold in the text):

Introduction [text].

Sources [text].

Methodology [text].

Results [Text].

Discussion [Text].

Conclusions [Text].

- At the end of the article, the list of references should be presented in accordance with the international bibliographic standard of the American Psychological Association under the heading References (see below).
- The list of references is followed by a detailed summary of the article in English Abstract (see below for its formatting requirements).
- List of keywords (in Ukrainian and English; keywords are separated by semicolons)
- In addition to the article, the author should attach a separate file with PERSONAL INFORMATION, containing: name, surname, patronymic (in full), academic degree, academic title, position, [affiliated] institution, its address, email, Orcid ID, fields and scopes of research interests.
- The Editorial Board retains the right to select material for publication. Articles that do not meet the requirements for publication will not be considered and will not be published. The article may be returned to the author for revision and/or accepted for publication in the next volume.

BIBLIOGRAPHY / REFERENCES STYLE AND FORMATTING

The bibliography consists of one block:

References should be written in English according to the international bibliographic standard of the American Psychological Association (APA Style). [https://www.library.cornell.edu/research/citation/apa.htm].

The titles of periodicals in Ukrainian (journals, collections, etc.) are given in transliteration (see the rules of Ukrainian transliteration: http://zakon2.rada.gov.ua/laws/show/55-2010-%D0%BF) and in brackets — in English. For example: Ekonomicnij Casopis-XXI [Economic Annals-XXI]. For the display of Cyrillic characters, see http://translit.cc.

References in the bibliography are listed in the order in which they appear in the text.

The structure and content of the author's ABSTRACT (at least 250 words with an interval of 1 pt)

- Full name, surname, Academic degree, Academic title, position, affiliation, e-mail (in English).
- Title of the article (in English)
- Problem Statement Introduction.
- Purpose Purpose.
- Research methods Methods.
- Scientific novelty of the research results Originality.
- Main results of the study Results.
- Conclusions Conclusion.
- Key words (5-7) Key words.
- -The information in the title of the article should not be repeated in the text of the abstract. Conventional introductory phrases (e.g., «the author of the article believes that...») should be avoided. Philosophical references, if they are not the main content of the document, descriptions of previously published works and well-known provisions should not be included in the abstract.
- The abstract should use syntactic constructions corresponding to the language of scientific documents, avoiding complex grammatic constructions.
- The text of the abstract should use keywords from the text of the article.
- The text of the abstract should be concise and clear, free of redundant information, unnecessary / conventional introductory words, as well as generalized and unimportant phrases.
- Abbreviations and special symbols, other than those in common use, should be used only in exceptional cases (when, without them, there is no way to present a comprehensive abstract).
- The abstract should be written in professional English. Mixture of American and British English is unacceptable. Computer translations will be returned to the authors for revision.
